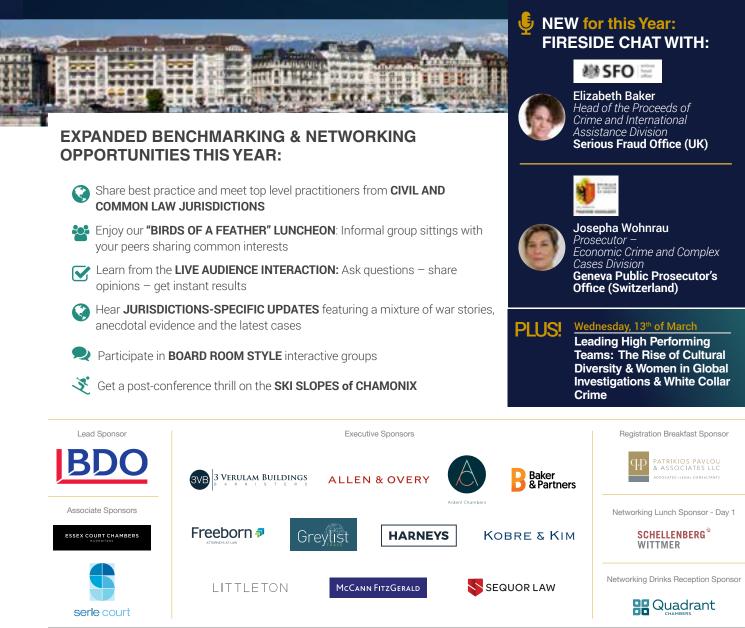

Knowledge, Organisation and Chaos – Are Lawyers Blind?

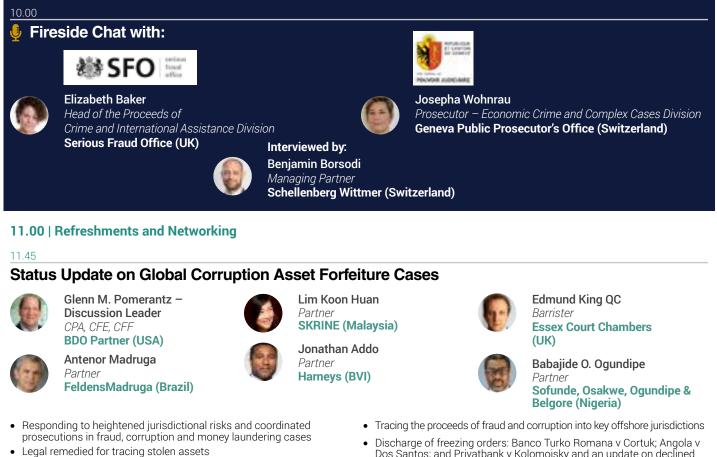
